How will the school support me if my child has difficulties accessing work online?	They will call each week to speak to a family if you have not been online. The class teacher will work with you to discuss your personalised circumstances and the safest solution to support your child's learning. Options can include provide learning on paper, applying to the DfE get help with technology schemes for improved internet access, borrowing a school device or if needed, the pupil to attend on-site. How will you assess and give feedback on my child's learning?	Feedback through Tapestry of the learning added.		Regular assessment and feedback through teaching activities, questioning during live interaction, review of submitted learning, test results from digital platform tests and quizzes, review of written tests and assessments.	
How will you check that my child is engaging with the learning?	Weekly Telephone call to discuss their learning and through Tapestry.		Daily: Attendance register of live teaching. What will happen if the school is fully open but my child is self-isolating?	The school will provide remote education as soon after it is notified of a pupil needing to self-isolate as possible. For the first one or two days, it may be necessary for children to access learning through printed packs, Oaklands Academy of through Live Lessons. The school will contact you to arrange this. The school will then provide the remote education offer as described above.
